After your airport pickup, we'll take a taxi to Terapacá and begin a 2-hour jungle walk to the Maloca indigenous community, learning about timber trees, medicinal plants, and local cultures along the way.

At the Maloca (traditional longhouse), the shaman will welcome you and explain its cultural significance, as well as the use of sacred substances such as mambe, coca, rapé, ambil, and tobacco.

A traditional lunch will be served.

In the afternoon, we'll visit the chagra (community garden) where cassava, bananas, pineapple, coca, and tobacco are grown. Together with community members, you'll help prepare regional dishes for dinner.

The day ends with a night walk to spot bioluminescent mushrooms and other fascinating species.

Accommodation: Hammocks with mosquito nets.



Day 1: Wildlife Exploration





Day 2: Tree House Reserve



Stare breakfast at the Maloca we go to a Natural Reserve where we will find a tree house. We will have lunch and then we are going to walk until we reach the tree house. At the end of the afternoon we will have time to rest and immerse ourselves in the beauty of the jungle. After dinner we can do a night walk to explore the jungle in the dark and be able to observe different types of insects and animals of that environment.

First thing in the morning we will start the day with a short walk until we reach one of the platforms where we will begin the ascent in ropes to the first platform located 40 meters high. After a panoramic view of the canopy, the highest part of the jungle, we will start to go from tree to tree with zip lines. After the hight path we will have fresh breakfast at the reserve.



Day 3: Marasha

Breakfast at the Natural Reserve is followed by a taxi and boat ride to the Marasha Nature Reserve in Peru. We will have to walk for approximately 1 hour and 45 minutes until we reach the Reserve's facilities. During the walk, you will experience the jungle, learn about timber and medicinal trees. Furthermore, there is the opportunity to observe different species of birds that inhabit the area. After lunch at the Nature Reserve we can go Piranha fishing, bird watching, canoeing or kayaking around the river and see some beautiful spots close by. In the evening, after dinner, you have the option to head out for some caiman spotting in canoas and enjoy the night sky



Day 4: Leticia

We will have breakfast early in the morning and take the boat to Leticia, which will take us around 2 hours. We will then drop you off in town or take you to the airport as requested.
