Day 1: Wayruru Indigenous Community

Receive a warm welcome at the airport before taking the road by taxi toward Tarapaca , where a 2-hour jungle walk leads you to the Wayruru community. Along the way, discover towering timber trees, medicinal plants, and the customs of local indigenous cultures. At the Maloca, meet the shaman, learn about sacred rituals with Mambe, Rapé, Ambil, and tobacco, and enjoy a traditional lunch. Visit the chagra to see crops like cassava, banana, and pineapple, then help prepare dinner with community members. End the day with a magical night walk to see bioluminescent mushrooms and nocturnal wildlife.



Day 2: Marasha Natural Reserve



Breakfast at the Maloca is followed by a taxi and boat ride to the Marasha Nature Reserve in Peru. We will have to walk for approximately 1 hour and 45 minutes until we reach the Reserve's facilities. During the walk, you will experience the jungle, learn about timber and medicinal trees. Furthermore, there is the opportunity to observe different species of birds that inhabit the area.

After lunch at the Nature Reserve we can go Piranha fishing, bird watching, canoeing or kayaking around the river and see some beautiful spots close by. In the evening, after dinner, you have the option to head out for some caiman spotting in canoas and enjoy the night sky



Day 3: Monkey Island, Mario Rivera, Pink Dolphins



Your journey begins with a boat ride along the Amazon River. On the way, we stop at Monkey Island (Isla de los Micos), a natural reserve known for its friendly squirrel monkeys and rich wildlife.

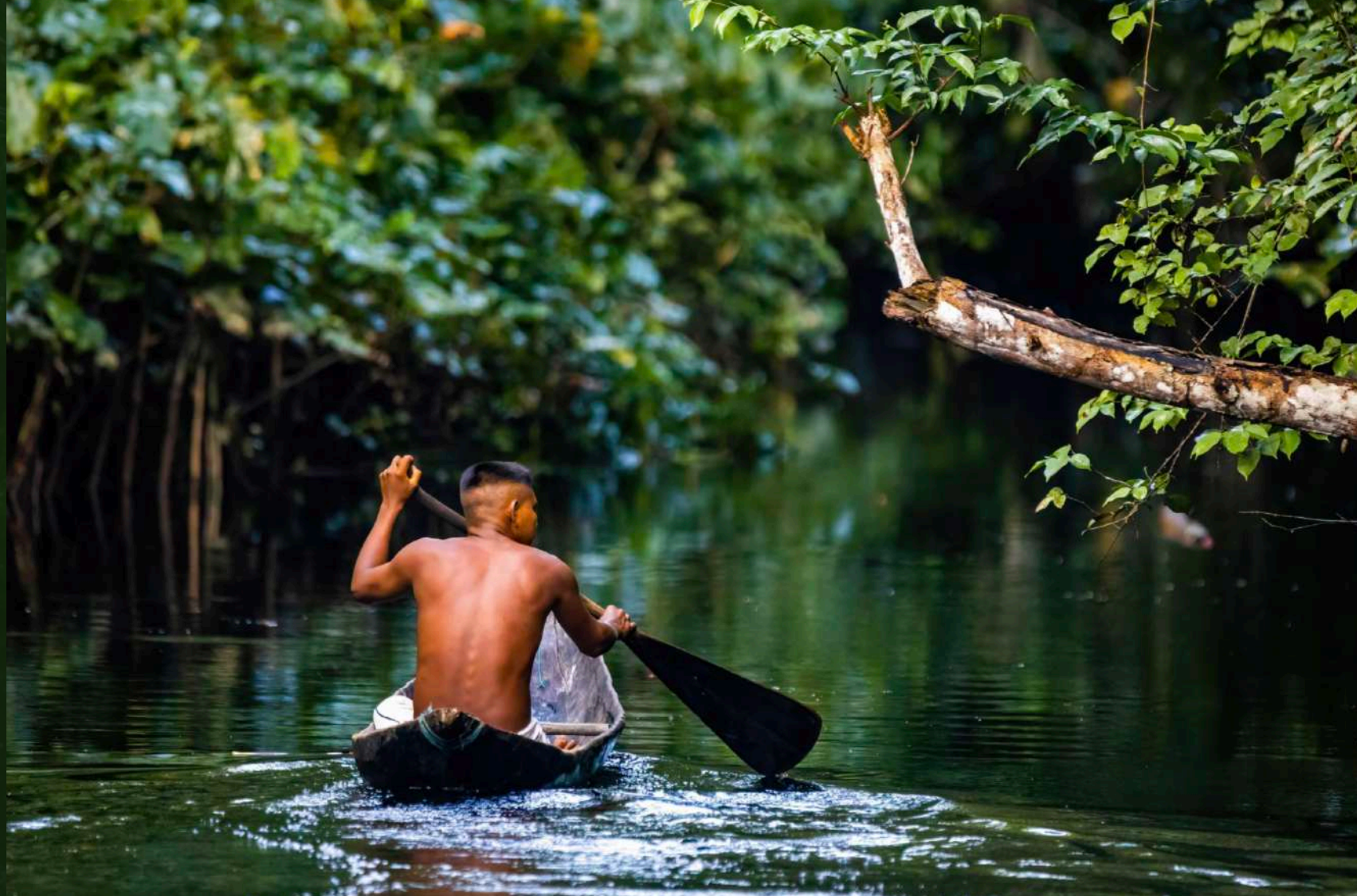
We then continue to the Ticuna community of Mario Rivera, with chances to spot birds along the river. Upon arrival, enjoy a short jungle walk, lunch, and time to relax. In the afternoon, we head out to look for pink and gray river dolphins, enjoy a refreshing swim, and watch the Amazon sunset.

At night, take a guided walk to explore the rainforest's nocturnal life before spending the night in a comfortable room with a bed and mosquito net.



Day 4: Leticia

We will have breakfast early in the morning and take the boat to Leticia, which will take us around 2 hours. We will then drop you off in town or take you to the airport as requested.
